Councilwoman Roche Board of Education, American Legion & Public Affairs

Councilwoman Roche reports that most of her committees will start meeting beginning in September. The Board of Education met and were working on the re-opening of the school. If you go on line there is a re-opening 2021 schedule which will explain everything about from the meals in the cafeteria to the mitigating risks to synchronized learning and when your child should stay home. It is a very comprehensive power point presentation that was presented on Tuesday night. The parents are divided as to masks vs. no masks. They seem to be very evenly divided. The school is writing to the Governor's Office to try to get it to be a choice of the parent or household. The teachers are working without a contract so there are a lot of teachers at the meeting. There was supposed to be a Union meeting yesterday – however she would not know the outcome of this private meeting.

Councilwoman Woodruff Recreation & UBSA

Mrs. Woodruff discusses that she met with the Recreation Commission this past Monday and they had a very successful movie in the Park. They had put out on Face Book asking the residents for their three top Christmas movies for their Christmas in July event. Each person attending received a ticket so that they could receive popcorn and cotton candy. They gave out over 208 tickets. This was a very successful night. They said it was very well received. There were no glitches – the weather was good. The Wednesday Beach nights have also been a huge success again this season. They have quite a few people showing up at about 7 p.m. – it seems to be the same group every week. This has been a big success. On 10/23 Recreation will be holding a Fall Festival at Scholer Park. They are looking at times from 2-6 p.m. They will be having harvest type activities: pumpkin painting, pumpkin patch for the little ones, crafts, jump houses, costume contests and vendors. More details will follow on this, but they hope for a nice turnout considering everything that Recreation has had this year has gone very well. They plan to end the night with a Halloween Movie. ORDINANCE # 2021-305 - TABLED

AN ORDINANCE BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL AMENDING THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH CODE OF ORDINANCES TO REPEAL CHAPTER 10-5 BUILDING AND HOUSING, NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE REGULATIONS AND FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION; TO ADOPT A NEW CHAPTER 10-5; TO ADOPT FLOOD HAZARD MAPS; TO DESIGNATE A FLOODPLAIN ADMNISTRATOR; AND PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE CALENDAR YEAR 2021

Purposes and objectives. The purposes and objectives of these regulations are to promote the public health, safety and general welfare and to minimize public and private losses due to flood conditions in specific flood hazard areas through the establishment of comprehensive regulations for management of flood hazard areas, designed to: (1) Protect human life and health. (2) Prevent unnecessary disruption of commerce, access, and public service during times of flooding. (3) Manage the alteration of natural floodplains, stream channels and shorelines; (4) Manage filling, grading, dredging and other development which may increase flood damage or erosion potential. (5) Prevent or regulate the construction of flood barriers which will divert floodwater or increase flood hazards. (6) Contribute to improved construction techniques in the floodplain. (7) Minimize damage to public and private facilities and utilities. (8) Help maintain a stable tax base by providing for the sound use and development of flood hazard areas. (9) Minimize the need for rescue and relief efforts associated with flooding. (10)Ensure that property owners, occupants, and potential owners are aware of property located in flood hazard areas. (11)Minimize the need for future expenditure of public funds for flood control projects and response to and recovery from flood events. (12)Meet the requirements of the National Flood Insurance Program for community participation set forth in Title 44 Code of Federal Regulations, Section 59.22. (Full Ordinance on file in the Clerk's Office)

ORDINANCE 2021-306

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE DESIGNATED REDEVELOPMENT PLAN AREA NO. 3 OF THE COMMERCIAL CORRIDORS REDEVELOPMENT PLAN PURSUANT TO THE NEW JERSEY LOCAL REDEVELOPMENT AND HOUSING LAW (NJSA 40A:12A-1, ET SEQ.)

WHEREAS, on November 21, 2016, the Borough Council of the Borough of Union Beach (the "Governing Body") adopted Ordinance No. 2016-243, which designated certain lands along the Union Avenue and NJ State Highway No.36 corridor as a "Redevelopment Areas" pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law (NJSA 40:A 12A-2 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey local Redevelopment and Housing Law, NJSA 40A:12A-` et seq., authorizes the Borough Council of the Borough of Union Beach ("the Governing Body") to adopt by ordinance redevelopment plans for areas in need of redevelopment or rehabilitation; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body previously adopted the Commercial Corridor Redevelopment Plan (the "Redevelopment Plan") by Ordinance on November 21, 2016; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the New Jersey Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, NJSA 40A:12A-1 et seq. (the "LRHL"), the Governing Body authorized the preparation of an amendment to the redevelopment plan for the Designated Redevelopment Area No.3the tract defined as Block 210, Lots 25 and 26; and

WHEREAS, the Borough's planning consultant, T&M Associates, has prepared an amendment to the redevelopment plan for the Designated Redevelopment Area No.3; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council now wishes to approve and adopt the Amend the Bulk and Area Requirements for Redevelopment Plan Area No.3 in the form attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.

WHEREAS, pursuant to NJSA 40A:12-7, the Governing Body referred the Redevelopment Plan Amendment to the Planning Board for review; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that the Redevelopment Plan is necessary and appropriate and will effectuate redevelopment and rehabilitation within the Borough.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Union Beach, in the County of Monmouth, that the Maximum Residential Density (dwelling units per acre) of the section entitled "Bulk and Area Requirements" of the Designated Redevelopment Area No. 3, Page 29 is hereby amended to 10 du/acre.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Union Beach, in the County of Monmouth, that the Amendment to the Commercial Corridor Redevelopment Plan is hereby adopted, and the provisions of the Redevelopment Area No.3 shall be revised accordingly.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that all prior Ordinances that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law, as the "Ordinance Approving an Amendment to the Commercial Corridor Redevelopment Plan."

ORDINANCE #2021-307:

An Ordinance fixing the Salaries, Wages and other Emoluments of Certain Employees of the Borough of Union Beach, Monmouth County, New Jersey

Pursuant to a Collective Bargaining Agreement with Teamsters Local No. 641 For the Calendar year 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024

Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Union Beach, as follows:

Section 1: The following shall constitute the salaries, wages and emoluments of the indicated employees of the Borough of Union Beach, payable as hereinafter provided and effective as of the adoption of this Ordinance, and the publication of notice of such adoption, in accordance with law, and continuing in effect until thereafter amended, except where otherwise specified. The employees of the Borough of Union Beach covered by this ordinance shall be compensated bi-weekly pursuant to the following salary guide for calendar years 2021, 2022, 2023 and 2024.

<u>Section 4</u>: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be deemed repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

<u>Section 5</u>: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and publication in accordance with law.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING T&M ASSOCIATES TO DEVELOP PRELIMINARY CONSTRUCTION COSTS AND OBTAIN FIELD SURVEY DATA NEEDED TO PREPARE CONCEPT PLANS AND CONSTRUCTION ESTIMATES FOR A POSSIBLE COOPERATIVE PROJECT WITH THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH TO IMPROVE A SECTION OF FRONT STREET NEAR THE FLAT CREEK BRIDGE

Whereas, a portion of Front Street near Flat Creek Bridge becomes impassable to vehicles during high tides and;

Whereas, the County Engineers Office have met with our Engineers on behalf of the Borough regarding a possible cooperative project to improve Front Street conditions in that area; and

Whereas, in order to participate in a possible cooperative joint project with the County of Monmouth to minimize this nuisance flooding, the Borough hereby authorizes T&M Associates to develop preliminary construction costs and to obtain field survey data as needed to prepare concept plans and construction estimates for a possible cooperative project with the County of Monmouth to improve this section of Front Street.
