AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH, 1980," CHAPTER III, POLICE REGULATIONS, SECTION 3-9.13, RATES TO BE CHARGED BY WRECKERS, a.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH that Chapter III, Police Regulations, Section 13-9.13, a. Maximum Rates:, is hereby amended as follows:

13-9.13 a. Maximum Rates: The maximum rates that may be charged for the use of a wrecker, whether licensed or unlicensed, for towing a disabled vehicle from a point within the Borough to a destination also within the Borough are as follows:

1. Basic Towing (24 hrs.) (light duty, under 4,000 lbs.)	\$ 150.00
2. Winching and/or recovery service 1st ½ hour	\$ 250.00
Every ½ hour after (plus \$ 3.00 a foot cable or chain)	\$ 150.00
3. Clean-up/Absorbent charge- charged in ½ hour increments	\$ 75.00
4. Waiting time: charged in ½ hour increments If delay is for removal by First Aid or pursuant to instruction	
by police.	\$ 65.00
5. Storage Per Calendar date: Outside Inside	\$ 50.00 \$ 75.00
For inside storage \$ 75.00 rates applied to the 1 st 24 hrs. only Unless owner of the auto consents to inside storage beyond 24hrs.	
6. Vehicle Removal Charge, if towed to another site at the request of the owner of the vehicle	\$ 65.00

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-143

RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF NEW JERSEY STATE
ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 2108 AND SENATE BILL NO. 1041
PROHIBITING THE TREATMENT, DISCHARGE, DISPOSAL, OR
STORAGE OF WASTEWATER, WASTEWATER SOLIDS, SLUDGE,
DRILL CUTTINGS OR OTHER BYPRODUCTS FROM NATURAL GAS
EXPLORATION OR PRODUCTION USING HYDRAULIC FRACTURING.

WHEREAS, in the State of New Jersey 216th Legislature A.2108 was introduced in the Assembly on January 16, 2014 and S.1041 was introduced in the Senate on January 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Bills introduced prohibited treatment, discharge, disposal, or storage of wastewater, wastewater solids, sludge, drill cuttings or other byproducts from natural gas exploration or production using hydraulic fracturing; and

WHEREAS, the term "hydraulic fracturing: shall include "fracking," "hydrofracking," "hydrofracturing," and other colloquial terms for this drilling technique, which refer to the drilling technique of expanding fractures or creating new fractures in rock by injecting water, often with chemicals, sand, or other substances, and often under pressure, into or underneath the surface of the rock for the purposes including, but not necessarily limited to, well drilling and natural gas exploration and production; and

Whereas, the practice of the frilling technique of hydraulic fracturing for natural gas exploration and production has been found to use a variety of contaminating chemicals and materials and uses vast quantities of water mixed with chemicals and solids pumped in the process resulting in millions of gallons of contaminated water flowing back of the well causing dangers and uncertainties for wastewater treatment plants, the environment and health and safety of the public; and

WHEREAS, wastewater, wastewater solids or sludge, drill cuttings and/or other byproducts from the fracking process have been known to contain toxic levels of contaminants such as benzene, naphthalene, toluene, formaldehyde, diesel, cadmium, mercury, arsenic, and unknown quantities of hundreds of other undisclosed carcinogenic and endocrine-disrupting chemicals, heavy metals, and radioactive materials; and

WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's Department of Environmental Protection has documented three facilities in NJ as accepting waste from hydraulic fracturing operations, posing a direct threat to NJ's drinking water; and

WHEREAS, the treatment, discharge, disposal, or storage of fracking waste pose a threat to NJ's air, land, aquifers and surface waters through the risk of spills and accidents, open pit storage, truck transport on roadways, and severe weather events that cause flooding; and

WHEREAS, fracking is exempt from important regulations meant to protect public health and the environment, specifically sections of the Clean Air Act, Clean Water Act, Safe Drinking Water Act, Resource Conversation and Recovery Act, Superfund, and National Environmental Policy act: and

WHEREAS, no federal or State standards have been adopted governing the treatment and disposal of hydraulic fracturing waste;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough of Union Beach hereby supports a statewide ban on the treatment, discharge, disposal, or storage of wastewater, wastewater solids, sludge, drill cuttings or other by products from natural gas exploration or production using hydraulic fracturing.
