Councilman Wicki: Finance, Personnel and Administration

We received a final Sanitary Sewer Report for this year's Program. We were able to inspect 25,800 linear feet of sewer mains. This equals 4.88 miles worth of sewer mains. They have been inspected and we have made 214 repairs to that system which helps prevent infiltration. This is the second year of a three year program that is required by our new agreement with the BRSA. This year's program went from the Henry Hudson Trail north to Bayview and from Poole Avenue over to Bayview. We have tightened up many areas on that system.

The Monmouth County Workforce Development Program comes to an end for us on December 31st. We want to thank you to not only the individuals who are leaving us at the end of the month, but to all those who have worked in the Borough during the past two plus years. We sincerely thank them for their help during our recovery process.

On tonight's agenda we have the hiring of two employees for the beginning of January, John Barresi will be joining us officially as our Building Maintenance Worker. He has been working with us as part of the Monmouth County Workforce Development and will now be filling the vacancy that we have had in this position for several years. As you know our Borough Administrator, Jennifer Maier has submitted her letter of resignation which is effective December 31st. Her office has provided a great deal of assistance to many of our residents and the recovery process following Super storm Sandy. Many on this Council feel that it is in the best interest of the residents of Union Beach to fill this position with the best possible candidate in an expeditious fashion. The Personnel Committee met with and interviewed a candidate who we believed was the best qualified individual to be our new Borough Administrator. The Committee has made a recommendation to the Council and it is on the Agenda for later in the evening to offer this position to Mr. Robert M. Howard, Jr.

Mr. Howard comes to us with a very unique set of qualifications to become our new Borough Administrator. To begin with, he is a long time resident of the Borough of Union Beach. We have come to realize that we cannot minimize the benefit of this fact. Union Beach is a small tight-knit community and Mr. Howard knows how important it is to the residents of Union Beach to maintain these characteristics along with all of the little things that makes Union Beach different and so special. Mr. Howard brings 22 years of experience as a Councilman, he understands the workings of Municipal Government and how the Borough Administrator can best assist and be an asset to the Governing Body. He has sat on Council and was instrumental in updating the job description prior to the hiring of our last Administrator. He best knows what is expected of him to be an effective Borough Administrator. During his time spent on Council, Mr. Howard was Chairman of the Finance Committee for 19 years. A significant part of the job of Borough Administrator is to work with the Borough's Finance Office and the Council's Finance Committee in preparing the Annual Budget. His experience in preparing 18 consecutive Budgets in the past will lead to an introduction of a fiscally sound budget without administrative delays. Additionally, it must be pointed out, that Mr. Howard has been working with this Governing Body and the Borough Engineer to win approval of the Army Corp of Engineers Shore Protection Project since its inception. This type of experience working for the residents benefit and protection is a major asset as we move forward on this project. Finally, Mr. Howard and his family were also impacted by super storm Sandy. He has first-hand experience in what it is like to have to move out to make repairs to your home. His knowledge in dealing with contractors, government agencies and the entire grant application process, brings an added level of service and help that he can provide to the residents of Union Beach. After all it is one of the main objectives of this Governing Body to do everything that we can possibly do to get our residents back in their homes. It is the belief of most of the members of this Governing Body that the hiring of Mr. Howard is the best thing that we can do for the residents of Union Beach.

Councilwoman Roche: Public Works & building and Grounds, American Legion

Councilman Andreuzzi: Public Safety, Health, Education, Recreation and Special Grants

Mr. Andreuzzi congratulates the Recreation Commission, Mrs. Metz, and The Memorial School Orchestra for a very successful Christmas Tree Lighting on December 7th. The Mayor and Council would also like to thank our Volunteer Recreation Commission Members, our Dept. of Public Works, our Police Dept., EMS and the Fire Department for helping Santa to get here to Union Beach to distribute gifts to over 125 of our children. The Union Beach Recreation Commission Basketball is set to commence on Monday, January 12th. All games will be played during the week. Schedules may be acquired by contacting our Recreation Commission.

<u>Post Sandy Planning Committee</u> continues to work on plans for projects approved by and funded fully by the Department of Community Affairs. Second Round Planning Studies are now underway. Initial Project Review Meetings have already been held with our Planning Board. Stake Holder Meetings were held in the last few weeks before Thanksgiving to provide input to the Planning Board and its Master Plan Reorganization. The last meeting of the Planning Committee was held on December 10th. All Planning Studies are scheduled to be completed by May of 2015. There are six separate plans. It is a lot of work.

<u>Environmental:</u> One of the goals of the Watershed Council for 2015 is to educate decision makers in local communities such as ours about the risk and vulnerability of future sea level rise. The Council will be sending important information and update the Bayshore Mayors and Administrators. The Council meets on the 2nd Thursday of each month at 7:30 p.m. at Keyport Borough Hall. While each town has an official representative, everyone is invited to attend and participate in Council activities.

Board of Education: Mr. Andreuzzi thanks Councilwoman Roche for attending the meeting on December 9th for him as he was meeting with his own parents at JP Stevens High School. It was a fun night. The Agenda for the meeting was relatively short, but included an authorization for numerous class trips and activities. The Board is currently researching the establishment of a more efficient late bus schedule to Red Bank Regional and Keyport High Schools. The Board is also looking to establish a more efficient recycling plan for the Memorial School Cafeteria. Workshops will begin very shortly on how to administer the computer based PARCC tests. Teachers will be required to take practice tests as well. He has seen the demonstration of some of these tests in his school and it is a huge difference from what the students are used to taking. Work continues to be done on the baseball field as weather permits. Finally, with the arrival of cold weather, our school custodians have been concentrating on making sure that all rooms are properly heated and so far so good.

Bob brings a very unique set of skills to Union Beach, so far as being a resident for many years and he has served on this Governing Body for over 20 years. We face very unique challenges every day, financially. We face challenges in town that Bob has been there every step of the way and we feel that this is going to be the perfect fit. He can't wait for Bob to start because he knows what Bob brings to Union Beach. He is happy that we hired this quickly and it is the right person.

MEETING OPEN FOR PUBLIC DISCUSSION:

Meeting opens for Public Discussion at 8:24 p.m.

Ryan Sobin, 543 Aumack Avenue: He asks a few questions of the hiring committee:

How many applications did you get for the new Business Administration Position? How many resumes were submitted? Mayor states that Mr. Sobin knows the answer to that question.

Mr. Wicki states that the Personnel Committee, and a majority of the Council felt that it was in the best interests of the residents to fill that position as quickly as possible.

Mr. Sobin states that the last time when Jennifer Maier was hired you went through the vetting process, collected multiple resumes, interviewed for the position.

Mr. Wicki states that it took us 5 months to get through the process.

Mr. Sobin states that normally a person gets 60 days and that gives you time to find someone else. Other towns do it in 60 days. Jennifer brought qualifications....

Mr. Wicki disagrees.

Discussion as to Asbury Park Press.

Mr. Sobin states that by best possible candidate Mr. Wicki means one candidate. Mr. Wicki states that in his report prior he listed why Mr. Howard is the best candidate. No one else would have those qualifications.

Mr. Sobin asks if the Job was posted? It was not

Mayor Smith is happy to have the person that we are to hire.

Mr. Sobin is fine with the person hired however he disagrees with the hiring process.

Mr. Smith states that at this time we are in need of Business Administrator

Mr. Wicki states that there are people trying to get back into their homes and we felt it is in the best interest of getting people back into their homes not to have this seat empty while we conduct a search and interview and search through resumes. We did what we did in the best interests of the residents of Union Beach. We are concerned with getting our residents back home. If there are people who disagree with that process this is up to them.

Mr. Sobin states that he hopes the next time when you look for a qualified candidate you will open it up to just more than one person. If you look at the recent voting history of Union Beach,....this is just his opinion

<u>Patrick Spagnuolo, 400 Campbell Street, Union Beach – Discusses progress with the Army Corp Flood Prevention Project.</u> He asks about the 2015 projected start date. At the last meeting Councilman Wicki discussed the reviewing of the Flood Plan. He asks about this review process.

<u>Councilman Wicki</u> explains the process of the revaluation study of the project. Those results which were promised to us last summer have not been received from the State.

<u>Mayor Smith</u> states that he received a call from Senator Booker's office on Monday who stated that this report will be released in February.

Mr. Spagnuolo discusses the flood plan available in the Construction Officials Office and asks what they are reviewing.

<u>Councilman Wicki</u> states that the Mayor has been in contact with Officials on the State and Federal Level and has been sending letters to move this project. We were told that it would start in February. The Mayor and T&M our Engineers have been in constant contact.

Mayor Smith states that unfortunately, the Army Corp is doing a revaluation of the project.

Mayor Smith gives Mr. Spagnoulo a copy of a letter sent last week out to out Governor, Senators and our Congressman.

Mr. Spagnuolo discusses the work on the whole Jersey Shore, Union Beach was devastated and Shore Protection work has not started yet. We need what they have done down the shore. The point is that we have not had one dollar or one thing done on flood prevention and they are almost all done down the shores. It is our turn to get something done as far as flood prevention. He is worried.

Councilman Wicki assures Mr. Spagnuolo that the Mayor and Council agree 100%.

<u>Eileen Schlemm, 20 Heckelmann Street, Union Beach:</u> Regarding the previous speaker we all want protection but the money goes to the towns who make money. She also thanks the Mayor and Council as President of the Senior Citizens Organization for the cooperation this year. They really appreciate it and wish all a Merry Christmas and a Happy Healthy New Year. She invited all to the Reorganization as requested and a few will try to attend. She also states that she was a long-time employee of the Borough and many of those years Robert Howard was her Finance Chairman and you could not ask for a more efficient, more conscientious person for the position. She applauds the decision to hire him.

<u>Frank Wells, 104 State Street, Union Beach:</u> He congratulates the Mayor and Council for picking such an excellent candidate. He had worked with Bob Howard on Council for nine years. He has the integrity, the experience, finance personnel and he has worked for a law firm for the last 30 years. As far as the process is concerned since there are those concerned about it, and he understands where it is coming from, but it wasn't a while back when the Monmouth County did a nation-wide search for a President for Brookdale Community College. The man was vetted and all was done, he is now just getting out of jail because he abused his position and took advantage of the County Tax Payer – so he says go local, be organic, take care of our own people in town and get someone who you know you can count on.

<u>James Butler, 40 Knoll Court, Matawan, NJ –</u> As for the Sayreville Deal, you want no part of what is going on there They took money for homes and are demolishing these homes and the lands will become wetlands. They bought up the neighborhoods. So as much as people talk about money getting thrown around to different towns. Manlooking has abandoned those homeowners that were residents there. They built a sea wall but there has been no help to residents. When you talk about money that is going around everyone is doing things differently.

He is sure most of us are aware that next year is the 90th Anniversary of Union Beach being incorporated and he wants to be part of any plans for the 90th Anniversary Celebration like the anniversary fireworks. Maybe like the Destination America Celebration with a stage, vendors, etc. The town has been through a lot so maybe it is time to celebrate its history. He feels it would be nice to mark the history and maybe a nice jumping off point for moving forward.

Mayor Smith asks if Mr. Butler would like to Chair this committee. He would just like to get involved.

<u>Councilwoman Roche</u> states that she is a member of Recreation and he can speak to her and set something up. Maybe local bands also, old photos, etc.

Mr. Butler also states regardless of the process, he states that Mr. Howard and he have butted heads in the nicest way. The man is on top of details. He is cheap to the point of accounting for everything. Honestly, he looks forward to butting heads again with him for the next few years. The process is one thing that is up to you, but he is looking forward to working with Bob.

Mr. Spagnuolo, 400 Campbell Street – returns to the mic to speak about the Sayreville residents and the properties that were deemed unbuildable. Some of those people asked to get their homes bought out. Not condemned but due to flooding it was a blessing to be bought out. But the corrugated sea wall worked and the sand dunes. Margate it did not work. He would rather lose view but save his home.

<u>Joe Savy, 117 Henry Street, Union Beach</u> - speaks about the paving of Henry Street. Issues with aprons on a driveway that created a dam and a low spot, and a drainage pipe. 30,000 lb backhoe scraped up the road. He called T&M. There is dirt everywhere in the street, it needs to be cleaned. It looks terrible. Charlie, Dennis multiple phone calls. He has pictures of the job. We kept them for our files. This street needs to be power washed. He recommends not paying the vendor. The telephone pole on Florence also needs to be cleaned up like it does in every other town. Raritan Street work is substandard. Who is being paid to watch these jobs get done?

<u>Mayor Smith</u> states that this was not a reconstructed street, but a quick fix. It was next on the list when the money stopped coming and the CDBG grant area map was revised and this area was not included in the areas which were grant eligible.

<u>Charlie Cocuzza</u> – Sweepers will be sent down today and tomorrow to clean the street.

<u>Joe Savy</u> – Any help that we can be for when you to Army Corp about the Flood Project make sure you let all know.

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF CERTAIN PROPERTY OWNED BY THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH TO CONTIGUOUS PROPERTY OWNERS AS AUTHORIZED BY N.J.S.A 40A:12-13.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: IT IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED THAT THE FOLLOWING DESCRIBED PROPERTY, OWNED BY THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH, BLOCK 63 LOT 13, SHALL BE DECLARED SURPLUS PROPERTY.

SECTION 2: THE FOLLOWING PERSONS SUBMITTED BIDS AS CONTIGUOUS PROPERTY OWNERS IN THE

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-206:

EMERGENCY RESOLUTION - N.J.S. 40A:4-48

WHEREAS, an emergency has arisen in the Current Fund with respect to emergency street repairs and no adequate provision was made in the 2014 budget for the aforesaid purpose.
