COMMENTS BY COUNCIL PRESIDENT WICKI: Tonight's Amendment to the 2014 Budget was reviewed and approved by the State Department of Community Affairs. This Amendment reflects several grants that were received by the Borough between the time we introduced the budget and today. The Amendment also reflects the revised pension bills for both the Public Employees Retirement System and the Police and Firemen's Retirement System that were received after the introduction of the budget. Several other line items were amended to reflect conditions that have already occurred this year prior to adequate funding. This budget still anticipates a small tax increase of approximately 1.150 on the municipal tax rate. What this means to the resident that on a house assessed at the average assessment of \$166,000 and based on a house assessed at that value, it would equal an approximate increase of \$16.50 for the year. So the Municipal Tax increase was kept to as little as possible. The Borough is seeking all Federal and State Aid that is available thelp rebuild Union Beach after Sandy, replacement of our vehicles, buildings and infrastructures are a priority of this Council, while we are seeking all the assistance we can to get our residents back into their homes.

PUBLIC HEARING ON ORDINANCE NO. 2014-211:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "THE REVISED GENERAL ORDINANCES OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH, 1980," CHAPTER VII, TRAFFIC, SECTION 7-6.2, STOP INTERSECTIONS, SCHEDULE VIII

Whereas, the Mayor and Council have determined that due to traffic frequency and conflicting flows of traffic that the intersection of Park Avenue and Pine Streets requires a four (4) way stop signs with traffic on both street being required to make a full stop.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH that Chapter

VII, Traffic, Section 7-6.2, Stop Intersections, Schedule VII, is hereby amended to include the following:

Park Avenue and Pine Street

The intersection of Park Avenue and Pine Street shall be designated a FOUR-WAY-STOP, with appropriate stop signs on each corner.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that Public Works shall erect stop signs on all four corners in accordance with all applicable NJDOT signs designs and location; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that if any provision, paragraph, section or subsection of this chapter be found unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining provisions of this chapter shall remain in full force and effect and shall have continuing validity; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that all other sections of the ordinance remain in full force and effect; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final adoption in accordance with law.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES AND DEPARTMENT HEADS:

Councilman Mascilak: Library, Drug Alliance, EMS and Seniors

The EMS meeting was postponed due to the death of Firefighter Meyer so he will have that report next month. He will be meeting with the Seniors next week.

Library May Report:

Mr. Mascilak reports that through the efforts of O'Brien and Gert Brunelli were awarded a grant from the Better World Books totaling \$9,000.00 They are discussing the quotes and allocation of funds. John Haines is reviewing the quotes for the repair of the steps. There will be an upcoming event at Rita's Ice. He will let all know when more info becomes available. The Bowling Fundraiser has been put on hold pending the grant money from Kohls.

Drug Alliance:

The issue of the equipment on the lawns for the family picnic day has been resolved with the August 31st date of the picnic is prior to the work starting.

Councilwoman Roche: Public Works & Building and Grounds

There has been a lot of work going on at Borough Hall. The Fence has been installed between Helen Hayes Field and the Police Parking Lot to keep the soccer balls from hitting the police cars. An outlet has been installed in the Senior's Room along with a new electric stove. After it was determined that the temporary roof repairs were working, walls that had gotten wet were removed and new walls were installed in both the Board of Health Office and in the Borough Clerk's Office.

There was a huge turnout for this year's Memorial Day Parade and Public Works did a lot of work to get ready for it. They cleared sand from the Beachfront Promenade and parking area, made sure the route was cleaned, mowed and week wacked. In addition t this they were instrumental in insuring that our Dough Boy, WWII and JFK Monuments were back in place before the start of the weekend. She also thanks T&M for all their hard work on this also. Mr. Mike Kelly from DPW prepared a Float and it listed all the names of the Union Beach Residents lost in service to our Country from various wars. John Haines and Mary Mancini participated and rode in the Department's new pick up truck.

On May 29th Harold Werse, the Commissioner of the NJ Department of Labor and Workforce Development visited DPW to see the progress being made towards our recovery since Hurricane Sandy. A Workforce Development NEG Job Fair was also held and a a result of this, Mr. Haines had new Laborers beginning this next week. Mr. Haines submitted our annual Tonnage Grant for 2013 along with the REA Tax Statement. This grant is expected to have a value of over \$11,000.00 to the Borough.

The Department continues working on the following:

Mowing, Weed-wacking, filling potholes, maintenance of floors at Borough Hall, Street sweeping, Outfall and Catch Basin Cleaning, Property Clean Up-s and Repairs to the DPW Buildings and the Mechanic's Garage.

Mr. Haines also completed the necessary courses and has now become a Certified Sustainability Resource Management Professional.

The American Legion: Has no meetings for this Summer

This is an organization that helps the teachers and students get items such as band uniforms and equipment for plays and things that your tax dollars do not cover. We raise the funds for the kids for these things and it is a lot of fun. We just had a talent show and had well over 300 people attend and the kids had a great time. Councilman Williams Public Safety & Health (OEM,PD, Fire & Court

Police Department:

The Police Department participated in the "Click it or Ticket it" Grant resulting in 100 motor vehicle summonses. 77 were for seat belt violations. There were 162 motor vehicle summonses issued during the month of May with 3 DWI arrests. Chief Woollley attended the DARE graduation for our Memorial School on June 16th. The Parking Meter attendants started working at the Beachfront during May issuing summonses and assisting beach-goers. If you do not have a parking decal come to Borough Hall.

Sgt. Taddeo and Patrolman Gajewski finished a week long Police Assault Rifle Course. They are both now instructors in Police Assault Rifles. Patrolman Harriott completed Crash One Investigation School and Capt. Ervin attended and completed the Leads Leadership Class sponsored by the FBI.

<u>OEM:</u> As of Memorial Day Weekend, the plaque has been put on the monument at fireman's park listing the names of the members of OEM for 25 years or more. This is something Mr. Michael Harriott had requested and we were able to get that completed. It looks great so when you are up there, take a look it is a nice recognition of the OEM long term members.

The Board is planning to replace ten (10) univents which supply heat and air circulation in some of the classrooms. It is believe that some of the univents were damaged by Hurricane Sandy and the Board will be seeking some

type of reimbursement through it's insurance. There were a lot of concerns since some of these univents did not circulate the heat. They have managed to get all of the vents working and some will be replaced. Applications for anyone wishing to run in the School Board Elections this November are due no later than July 31st. The Board extends a vote of gratitude to Hazlet Superintendent Dr. Bernie Bragen, for waving the tuition costs for Union Beach residents who were temporarily relocated in Hazlet in the aftermath of the storm. Finally, Graduation will be held this Tuesday, June 24th. The Keynote speaker will be Councilman Landrigan of Madison. They have been a steadfast supporter of Union Beach since the storm and have helped us with the resilience in the aftermath of the storm.

Once again, this year, Madison is providing funds for 56 Memorial School students at no charge to send them to Camp. Our profound thanks to our friends of Madison for their remarkable generosity.

Planning Committee:

He announces that after nearly a year of working with our Engineers, our Community Stake Holders, including Police, OEM, Fire, Building and Construction, the NJ DCA has approved the Borough to receive a \$280,000 Grant as part of the post-sandy planning assistance program. The Grant categories include numerous projects including a Master Plan re-examination and the revitalization plan of the Route 36 Corridor. The Committee will continue to meet and work on these plans on a priority order in the near future.

Last week, he spent much time with the Union Hose Fire Department and he thanks the Mayor and Council for all their help and cooperation in this tragedy. This was a difficult situation for all of our fireman and we are proud of them in the handling of this situation. He thanks the Police Dept., EMS, OEM, DPW, the County and all the surrounding Towns that came to honor Firefighter Meyer's Final Call. It was very touching. He thanks GiGi Dorr for volunteering for help with the food and volunteer organization. Everyone came together like Union Beach usually does and we are very thankful. Our thoughts and prayers remain with Mr. Meyer's family.

POINT OF ORDER: Council President Wicki also thanks Mr. Cocuzza for all his help and that it was very nice to see so many people step up and help.

Councilman Wicki: Finance, Personnel and Administration

Finance Committee:

A majority of his report was the newly adopted budget. On the Agenda tonight we are going to award a bid to National Water Main Cleaning for the Sanitary Sewer Inspection and Maintenance Program. Park of our Agreement with the BRSA requires us to maintain our system. In negotiating the current contract, we had changed over from a flow system to an EDU system. We are no longer based on the flows, which had previously hurt us financially in the past. Residents may remember a few years ago we had a supplemental bill because at the end of the year we would get these enormous supplemental charges. To eliminate this we went over to the EDU system which results in stable sewer charges for the residents. Part of this agreement is for us to maintain our system. We had bonded for money two years ago to begin the program and again this year we continue with this program and we need to submit a report to the BRSA every five years demonstrating the actions that we have taken. We video all our sewer lines, we repair them, we replace them when needed and grout them whatever is necessary. This year we are set to spend \$117,710.00 for this program to meet our responsibilities to the contract.

Another item on the Agenda for tonight is that the Personnel Committee met with our DPW Director, John Haines and we will be approving his contract this evening. We are lucky to have Mr. Haines working for the Borough, he is a conscientious employee. If any residents have questions John and his staff are there to give answers. He has a can-do attitude and does a great job and we are happy to offer him a contract through the end of 2015.

Borough Administrators Report Jennifer Maier

Ms. Maier thanks Bob Burlew and the Construction Office Staff for helping on all the Building Code issues that arise while working on the Rebuild Union Beach Project. Whenever she calls, he helps immediately. This has been an enormous help. The Construction Code Official, Robert Parsells has been reaching out to all the Banks regarding our new Vacant Property Maintenance Ordinance and he has also been working with the Mosquito Commission on any pooling water and working to get help to get high grass cut for those residents who cannot get back into their homes.

Ms. Maier thanks Joseph Van Orden and Mike Kelly of DPW for their help in the Rebuild Union Beach Project. They cleared obstacles that were in the way of the modular home rebuilds.

She also thanks the Police Department for their help in traffic safety in the blocking of intersections and roads during the rebuild.

The Police are getting back to her with a letter regarding the software purchase.

The Fire Department reported that our new Homes will need plagards that had not been previously required.

EMS is looking to purchase a new type of a chair that will enable EMS to bring people longer distances down the stairs.

OEM is getting a second quote on the Siren Box so that we can move forward with this.

Ms. Maier thanks Alice Ostervich for all her help with the Office Move and installation rugs and return of furniture to the Offices. Court – the Gramco Recording has been set up on Friday the 20th.

Employees are on the Agenda tonight who will be hired under the Monmouth County Workforce Development Grant. There will be six for Construction Office, 4 Laborers for DPW and one Clerk Typist for Administration.

Local 641 Contract comments have been sent to the Union Representative as requested today.

The Employee Manual needs Council Comments back on the items that are now required by MEL JIF. We hope to have these revisions to the Employee Manual on the July Agenda. The items that they are asking us to add to our manual are domestic violence, video surveillance, communication media policy and rights and duties of volunteers and local government leader procedures all having to do with civil rights.

The IT staff continues to work with the Police Dept:, Construction Dept and Administration.

We are also finalizing our demolition list. We have approximately 50 homes that still need to come down and this would be part of the DCA program. She is working with Manuela Onacki, Robert Parsells, Desiree Durkin, Lee, and Jovia to finalize that list.

Yesterday, Mrs. Christie came to town and about 100 people and media were present to welcome two more families back home yesterday. It took approximately 100 entities to make this happen. We anticipate 10 more families will be in by the July 4th weekend and two different families after that.

POINT OF ORDER: Council President Wicki: - Mayor Smith wishes all the residents to know that yesterday the First Lady, Mrs. Christie was in town and prior to her making any public appearances, she without letting the media know, went to visit Union Hose Fire House and met with Mr. Baird and the Mayor and brought a floral arrangement to express her condolences to the members of the fire house for the loss of Mr. Meyer. We recognize her coming out and taking the time to support our firefighters.

MEETING OPEN TO THE PUBLIC:

Council President opens the Meeting to the Public for Discussion at 8:33 p.m.

Mr. Wally Van Orden, 525 Front Street, Union Beach: He thanks the Mayor and Council on behalf of the volunteers and all those who came out and helped and their generosity with the event. One quick note on Ordinance 2014-211 should read Park and Pine intersection not Park and Spruce.

Mr. Robert Parsells, 314 Harrison Avenue, Union Beach: discusses that the owner of Hydrair would like to keep the signage at the property for over the 30 days to have the signage on the new building such as a dedication plaque and dedicate sign to Fire Dept.

Mr. James Konig, 815 St. Johns Avenue, Union Beach: Discusses the sample resolution he provided regarding Fracking Waste not being allowed to be dumped into Union Beach. Apparently, Councilman Andreuzzi has been involved with the BRSA and they possibly could remove some of the Fracking Wastes and make a profit from it. The resolution he is offering tonight is that it would not allow them to dump any waste Borough from anywhere. It is full of poison. It is what they use to dig down and break up this rock to get the gasses. He is hoping that by offering this resolution we can stop the waste from entering the Borough of Union Beach.

Council President Wicki responds that we will look into this and discuss at our next Agenda Meeting.

Attny: Do you know if either of the Bills have passed?

Mr. Konig: These have passed. This resolution would be for individual towns to pass their own to allow the waste brought through their towns. We don't have shale here, but we don't want the waste either.

Mr. Konig also discusses Ordinance 2014-210 on the Agenda for tonight.

Mr. Wicki explains that these are job positions that have already been filled through the Workforce Development Program.

<u>Jeffrey Lantz, 153 Bruce Road, Red Bank, New Jersey (DPW Employee):</u> Discusses budget item for pension payment for employees. The Borough plans on paying its share, but is it just the Governor who plans to not fund the pension now. He was looking for a clarification.

Attny: Correct, the Borough will be funding its share of the pension.

Mr. Sam Lauro, 705 9th Street, Union Beach: Discusses the BRSA and the trucking of the sewerage up and down his street, the smell, the loading the incinerator that is already obsolete that they plan to open up. It is not a new incinerator it is the old one. The new one will not be ready for two years. The newer one was built 20 years ago. They are putting millions of dollars into this one that they think will work but they have doubled the size of this plant 20 years ago. They think this is their answer, but we are living like animals back there and it is terrible. You can't imagine what the smell is like. We are looking for help. This is on Saturday and Sundays. We need help. They don't know what they are doing. If he goes to their meetings they just close it down because they try to pacify him, but he knows more of what went on in the past 20 years than who they have left over there. When they doubled the size, they brought in two other towns, there was a moratorium on building back then. They built the new incinerator and now it is worse than it has ever been. They seem to control the town and do what they want back there. It stinks and is polluting up the whole place. This truck is up and down our roads. This is supposed to run twice a day but it runs more than that Sunday it was three, but as they load it the smell is horrendous. They need to dome it and keep the smell to themselves.

Attny: Besides trucking it out, he doesn't know what else they can do. We had sent a letter on behalf of the BRSA in order to get them to be allowed to truck the waste. We were trying to accelerate their processing over there.

Mr. Wally Van Orden, 525 Front Street, asks if there is a possibility that you can pass an Ordinance that they can't truck on Saturdays or Sundays or can you put a weight limit on those streets on Saturdays and Sundays where they can't truck? Smaller trucks would mean more trucks. Maybe reschedule of hours.

Attny: Even if we tried, he believes that they don't have the means to store it on site and the state legislation bars us from interfering on how they run the plant. We went through this with the delivery of other parts to the plant. They would have to repair it and all our streets have been mapped when the wind energy was to be delivered and again after the storm. We will bring this discussion to our BRSA representatives.

Mr. Gus Young, 120 Henry Street, Union Beach: Discusses a situation on Henry Street during Memorial Day Weekend involving a cave-in on the street which involved the Water Company. They have had nine blow-outs on that street in the last two years, three in one episode. They come they fix it and in this past episode, the patch started to sink. He called in April and May and Mary called on behalf of him through the DPW to come out and take a look as to what was going on. The finally got back to him and said that the street is a tragedy and that they are not in the business to make improvements on it. This is the town's responsibility and on Memorial Day Weekend, it caved in. This is of grave concern. If someone was driving on it or a pedestrian walking on it, there would be issues. They put a cone in front of his driveway where it caved in. This is their idea of fixing it. We had an episode that involved a front loader or a backhoe who was clearing the street of snow, and actually fell through their patch. We have several areas there where the asphalt is one inch thick. The playground has 4" of blacktop. The last time any remediation was done was in the 1980's. He is asking for help with the infrastructure of this street. Why the entire neighborhood but this one street?

Councilman Cocuzza states that he has spent many hours speaking to our Engineer discussing possibilities for Henry Street. In the meantime until we can find funding. Henry Street does not qualify for any Grant monies. It is too far outside the defined areas. Any funding for Henry Street would have to come directly from the Tax Payers budget not grant monies. They are looking towards quotes from Monmouth County as an option. We were unaware of the sink hole caused by the water company blow out. Perhaps millings could be added to the street. The street cannot be milled due to the 1 inch thickness. Mr. Wicki has also been asking the Freeholders for help from the County. We also want to get this street done. Discussion on the street map as to the last time the streets were done and the concern of the residents. Mr. Young had gone out and yellowed the potholes to be filled he circled the holes to be filled. He is concerned about the condition of this street and asks the Council to consider the urgency and the need for a flat stable surface. He also does not want the street sweeper sent. Pot hole filling may not be economical right now but he is asking for some consideration.

Mr. Cocuzza states that he will speak to Mr. Haines about filling these potholes spray painted in yellow paint.

Attny: Review map of work done on the roadway as prepared by T&M

Robert Parsells, 318 Harrison asks about bluestone on the street temporarily? Maybe grade out a dirty blue stone.
