MONMOUTH COUNTY OPEN SPACE HEARING - SCHOLER PARK HOCKEY RINK

<u>Mayor Smith calls Mr. Edward Broberg for Presentation of the 2015 Monmouth County Open</u> Space Application:

PUBLIC HEARING: Monmouth County Open Space Grant Program, Scholer Park Phase VI:

Located at Spruce Street and Prospect Avenue Scholer Park Improvements- Phase VI, (Block 152, Lots 1, 2, 3, 3.01, 11, 12, 13, Block 26, Lot 2, Block 33, Lot 1, Block 34, Lot 1, Block 35, Lot 1, Block 23, Lot 10, Block 24, Lots 6 and 6.01, Block 25, Lot 6.01, Block 27, Lot 1, Block 30, Lot 1, Block 31, Lot 1, and Block 32, Lot 1) for the rehabilitation of the Roller Hockey Rink;

Edward G. Broberg of T & M Associates:

This hearing is being held to gain public comment/input from the residents on the proposed improvements. Mr. Broberg provides the public with the background on Scholer Park: Phase I included two baseball field improvements, Phase II was parking lot and concession stand and skate park improvements, Phase III was the improvements to the Basketball Court, Phase IV is our Tot Lot, and Phase V was for general improvements to the overall park, landscaping, irrigation in and around the concession stand, picnic benches, park benches. The application is due on September 17th and Monmouth County requires a public hearing and comments to be taken by the residents.

Mr. Broberg describes the importance of the Monmouth County Open Space Grant Program administered by Monmouth County, Monmouth County Parks System and NJDOT to the Borough's infrastructure. He states that we have been involved in these projects for many years and we have been quite successful. This year's application is for the continued improvement of Scholer Park. We have had previous grants, some of the construction has been done, we have one active grant at this time. Construction for this grant will start next year. Mr. Broberg directs the audience to visit Scholer Park if they have not done so recently. He explains that it has been substantially improved after the storm and we will continue these improvements in the future. This year's grant request is for a project to rehabilitate the skating rink. The skating rink has been there for quite some time. It is in rough condition and it gets a lot of use. The Application is for \$150,000.00 This is a matching grant so if we receive the grant, the Borough will be required to spend up to \$75,000.00 as the Borough's contribution and the County would match this if the grant is approved.

We are going to resurface the rink, recolor coat the rink, replace the broken dasher boards and replace all of the fencing with very heavy duty fencing. We are also going to change the height of the fencing on both ends of the rink for safety reasons, especially now that there is a tot lot at the end. The area will be cleaned up and it would be a nice improvement as we approach the full development of the park. If we get approved, we will probably get notified later this year, or early next year and this construction project would take place in 2015 or 2016.

Public Hearing on Monmouth County Open Space Grant Application:

Mr. Broberg and Mayor Smith asks for any comments from the public regarding this project. Mayor Smith opens the Public Hearing on Monmouth County Open Space Grant Application at 8:17 p.m.

Councilman Cocuzza asks if this grant application is filed every year or every other year?

Mr. Broberg states that we are eligible every year, and that it is the Community Development grant that has an every-other year eligibility.

Mr. Broberg comments that if the residents have not been in that area, they should also take a ride down Spruce Street, which was recently raised and you can easily enter the Park via Spruce Street, the road has been reconstructed providing better access to the park.

With no one appearing to be heard, and no additional comments from the Governing Body, Mayor Smith closes the meeting to the public at 8:20 p.m.

RESOLUTION NO. 2014-150:

MONMOUTH COUNTY BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND ENABLING RESOLUTION FOR DEVELOPMENT OF SCHOLER PARK. PHASE VI

WHEREAS, the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders has approved an Open Space Trust Fund and established a Municipal Open Space Program to provide Program Grant funds in connection with municipal acquisition of lands for County park, recreation, conservation and farmland preservation purposes, as well as for County recreation and conservation development and maintenance purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Union Beach desires to obtain County Open Space Trust Funds in the amount of \$75,000.00 to fund Scholer Park Improvements- Phase 6, (Block 152, Lots 1, 2, 3, 3.01, 11, 12, 13, Block 26, Lot 2, Block 33, Lot 1, Block 34, Lot 1, Block 35, Lot 1, Block 23, Lot 10, Block 24, Lots 6 and 6.01, Block 25, Lot 6.01, Block 27, Lot 1, Block 30, Lot 1, Block 31, Lot 1, and Block 32, Lot 1) for the rehabilitation of the Roller Hockey Rink;

WHEREAS, the total cost of the project including all matching funds is \$150,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Union Beach is the owner of and controls the project site.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH THAT:

1. Edward G. Broberg, PE, Borough Engineer or his successor is authorized to (a) make an application to the County of Monmouth for Open Space Trust Funds, (b) provide additional application information and furnish such documents as may be required for the Municipal Open Space Grants Program and (c) act as the municipal contact person and correspondent of the above named municipality; and

- 2. The Borough of Union Beach is committed to this project and will provide the balance of funding necessary to complete the project as described in the grant application in the form of non-county matching funds as required in the Policy and Procedures Manual for the Program; and
- 3. If the County of Monmouth determines that the application is complete and in conformance with the Monmouth County Municipal Open Space Program and the Policy and Procedures Manual for the Municipal Grants Program adopted there to, the municipality is willing to use the approved Open Space Trust Funds in accordance with such policies and procedures, and applicable federal, state, and local government rules, regulations and statutes thereto; and
- 4. Edward G. Broberg, PE, Borough Engineer or his successor is hereby authorized to sign and execute any required documents, agreements, and amendments thereto with the County of Monmouth for the approved Open Space Trust Funds; and

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES AND DEPARTMENT HEADS:

Councilman Mascilak: Library, Drug Alliance, EMS and Seniors

<u>The Drug Alliance</u> Picnic will be on Sunday, August 31st from 1-5 p.m. Tables will be provided but attendees must bring their own chairs. The event will be free to the public and feature rides, bounce house for children, refreshments, popcorn, snow cones, hamburgers, hotdogs, corn on the cob, a pie eating contest, animal balloons, face painting, spin art, temporary tattoos and a live DJ.

<u>Library:</u> The Library brought in \$30.15 in fines and monies for the month July. Gateway will be installing a new free hot water heater. This will take place when the library is closed for Labor Day as will the step repair project. In speaking to the contractor, we awarded the bid to, Mr. Haines discovered that said contractor intended to add on an additional \$975 for railings to be installed by an additional contractor. As this was not agreed upon prior. Mr. Haines reached out to the next quote on the list and was able to get the project for the same price of \$3,500. of which Council agreed to split the cost of with the Library. The contract was then awarded to Pereira Masonry of Keyport. Work to begin next week. Mr. Mascilak thanks Mr. Haines for his time and efforts in resolving the issue.

Mr. Mascilak introduces an new business owner to the Council, Mike Torro of Torro Auto Repair, 1003 Florence Avenue.

Mr. Torro introduces himself and the Governing Body welcomes him to Town and wishes him luck.

Councilman Wicki: Absent Finance, Personnel and Administration

Councilwoman Roche: Public Works & Building and Grounds

The American Legion is on schedule with their building as can be seen if you ride past their location. The Lobsterfest was a great time. The weather was wonderful and the Firemen did a fine job as usual. DPW is on schedule with the picking up of vegetation and the repairs to the DPW building are on-going. The outfalls and catch basins continue to be cleaned and inspected for Damages. The Hockey rink was just discussed. The Mechanic's garage is being repaired weather permitting. She thanks T&M and DPW for doing such a wonderful job down at the beachfront. The flags are all up. The grass is great. The new fence looks good. Volleyball was a big hit last night sponsored by Recreation and there was a good crowd present. DPW is still working on getting quotes for the Police Department Cages upstairs and maybe once the weather is not as nice they will get some more quotes from fence companies.

Mr. Williams announced that Mrs. Patricia Wicki attended the NJ Department of Health Behavioral Health and Social Service Seminar in July. He spoke to Pat and she said it was a great seminar and she will give him more information, and very informative. She will be able to bring information back to our Board of Health.

Union Beach Police Department, July 2014:

Chief Woolley attended a senior leadership seminar in Bramshill England, sponsored by the NJ State Association of Chiefs of Police, the College of Policing in Bramshill and Fairleigh Dickinson. The Police Department will participate in the National Drug take back on September 27, 2014. Anyone with old or unused prescription drugs can bring them to Headquarters on September 27th and drop them off, no questions asked. This is sponsored by the Drug Enforcement Administration. Captain Ervin through the LESO Program has acquired numerous pieces of equipment of which the total cost would have been \$443,233.83. This is the Government Surplus Program.

The Police Department investigated 8 motor vehicle crashes with three injuries. There were 2 DWI arrests. There were 78 Motor vehicle summonses issued. The new hand guns are in and all the officers will be qualified in the new weapons by August 12, 2014. The New recruits were taken to Hazlet Police Department Range to familiarize themselves with their new weapons before reporting to the academy. The Police Department received a "Cops in Shops" Grant and will be in local liquor stores to prevent underage persons from buying alcohol.

Councilman Andreuzzi: Education, Recreation and Special Grants

The Recreation Commission is formulating its plans and events for the Fall Season. Volleyball at the beachfront featuring DJ Pete is being held on Wednesday Evenings at 6 p.m. This is Pete's last year as DJ and we wish him good luck.

The Board of Education has been very busy over the last several months preparing for the 2014-2015 scholastic year. Several new teachers have been hired, as well as a new facilities manager and new cafeteria service. The District will also be rolling out a state-of-the-art computerized grading system called Genesis. This system will enable parents to check their students' grade through an online portal anytime they want 24/7. During the Fall residents will note upgrades at the baseball fields such as upgraded fields and new dugouts. These upgrades are sponsored by the Architecture for Humanity courtesy of Nike. This will be fully funded. Due to the continued rehabilitation of the Soccer Fields at Helen Hayes, the Board of Education has graciously agreed to permit the Union Beach Soccer Association to utilize the Union Beach Memorial School for certain activities. Please check with the Soccer Association for specifics.

<u>The Post-Sandy Planning Project Steering Committee</u> in conjunction with T&M Associates has been assembling plans for our new second round projects fully-funded through the DCA. These include a Master Plan Re-examination, A Route 36 Corridor Plan, which we desperately need and an overall Capital Improvement Plan. Another meeting will be held in September to begin our prioritization of the projects.

<u>Environmental:</u> Clean Ocean Action will hold its October Beach Sweeps at the Beachfront on October 25th from 9-12:30 at the beachfront. Florence Avenue and Front Street is the Meeting area. Last year, more than 100 volunteers attended including students representing several area high schools and one high school from North Jersey. All are welcome to attend.

Councilman Cocuzza Public Affairs, Shared Services, Construction & Code Enforcement

Code Enforcement: Number of new complaints received 75. Number of Letters sent out to residents 69. Number of complaints resolved 65. Total Certificate of Occupancies for the Month of July 2014 were 23. The total collected from the Certificate of Occupancies was \$2,375.00. Total fees collected from Tennant Landlord Registration was \$270.00 Total Fees Collected from all Sources: \$2,645.00

Mr. Cocuzza thanks Mr. Robert Parsells for running all over town and checking all the properties for complaints of high grass, abandoned homes. He also thanks John Haines and DPW for responding to the list.

Construction Department:

The homes being raised and the new homes construction total 337 combined. We knew that this summer was going to get very busy once the good weather kicked in, and it appears that it has. Mr. Cocuzza thanks Bob Burlew and his staff at the Construction Office. They are doing a great job.

Mr. Cocuzza spoke to Mr. Dayback from T&M over the weekend regarding the Union Hose Fire Department Catch Basin in the parking lot was repaired by the contractor and the repair of the asphalt is under way. The Fire Department is grateful for this repair.

Henry Street water main is being replaced which will move the paving of the street back from our original estimate of August to mid-late September. Mr. Cocuzza spoke to a few residents and they are fine with this timeframe.

Mr. Cocuzza motions asks for approval to have the Clerk send a letter to the Monmouth County Freeholders and John Tobia, thanking them for the work done to the tidal ditches off of 3rd and Pine Street and Scholer Park, Front Street, Union Avenue, all those ditches. It appears to be eliminating a lot of problems. They are returning to do the tidal ditches running behind DPW, JCP&L in about a week or two.

Seconded by Councilman Andreuzzi and approved by voice vote for Clerk to issue letter.

Borough Administrators Report Jennifer Maier

DCA is coming in tomorrow (8/22) to tour the prefab homes.

Ms. Maier spoke to Andy Zabiega regarding the Fixed Assets Inventory that we need to do in order to meet the requirements of our Audit. Since the minimum requirement for fixed assets inventory is \$5,000.00 he is recommending that we could do the fixed assets inventory ourselves and just limit it to those items over \$5,000.00. This would be easy enough to enter into Edmunds. This would save us the cost of hiring an inventory company.

The Loaner Vehicle that Bob Burlew has been using needs to be returned at the end of this year. We did get some rough quotes of \$25,000 for a replacement vehicle which would be for next year's budget. The debris management plan was decided at the Agenda Meeting that would be handled by two sites: The Scholer Park Parking Lot of non-vegatative and the DPW site for the vegetative waste, this would be in the case of another storm. This will be sent in for the September 1st deadline. This will enable us to get a debris permit ahead of time for debris sites.

Ms. Maier suggests, Mayor and Council sign up for the CIPRO information provided by Michael Harriott, OEM Coordinator if they have not already done so.

CDS national survey of community based supports for healthy eating and active living was sent in.

The 12th homeowner is moving in their prefab home tomorrow (8/22) and we have two more families in que to get homes.

She has been meeting weekly with Gert Brunelli and Eileen Balut to update the Health Department Ordinances.

Bill Bradshaw of NJNG will be coming in on September 22nd to use the Council Chambers.

Bob Parsells has been doing a great job with sending out property abatement notices to John Haines and John Haines has been doing a good job staying on top of those and getting the sites abated. A lien is then placed on these sites. These are mostly vacant, abandoned, bank owned properties.

The digital billboard specifications have been prepared (rough draft) and approved by Zoning. It now has to go to bid. This bid spec was sent to John Lane for his review of any legal aspects.

The Solar Ordinances that were requested by Bob Burlew to be included in our Ordinances: Draft copies were given to Bob Burlew for his review.

Employee Manual was updated. It is in Mayor and Council Dropbox for comments at next Agenda Meeting. DPW funds have been reviewed as they relate to building repairs due to Hurricane Sandy, These total approximately \$28,000.00. A portion of the insurance proceeds can be used to replenish that amount in the budget, which would replenish the buildings and grounds account.

Auction of Borough vehicles and Office equipment will be the week of August 25th through August 29th. Another Auction will follow shortly after this auction.

DCA came in to speak about the demolition list of the 114 homes that we have to take down. We are updating the list with any new liens, and also noting whether any of those are substantially damaged properties. The DCA would be doing the inspections of these properties at the end of August and at the end of September beginning of October, letters would go out to those property holders. They will be letters asking if the State can be of any assistance in terms of helping people to be able to demolish their properties. It is not mandatory, people can opt out. There are no liens placed against the properties that are demolished.

Monmouth University did a survey for Municipal Government Helpfulness in the Recovery Effort and according to Resident Polls, Union Beach ranked 83% in Municipal Government Helpfulness from Sandy and the rest of the Bayshore at 57%. She gives accolades to the entire staff, Mayor and Council for keeping the Residents happy.

The Borough will be offering the Library \$1,750 for the repair of their steps.

She sent a letter to the Department of Labor requesting a postponement of Unemployment Insurance to be paid until the 2016 Budget Adoption. She believes this will be approved. This is primarily for Monmouth County Workforce Employees.

We are currently working again on the RIMS system. This is a system where we enter in all old records for the Department of Records Management to let us know whether we can shred these or not.

We have almost completed a listing of all the different contracts that the Borough has. When they expire, what the amounts are, if annual payments are due, etc.

ORDINANCES 2014-213:

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES, WAGES AND OTHER EMOLUMENTS OF THE REGULAR OFFICERS OF THE POLICE DEPARTMENT OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH, IN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH FOR THE FISCAL YEARS BEGINNING JULY 1, 2011 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2015

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: THE FOLLOWING SHALL CONSTITUTE THE SALARIES, WAGES AND EMOLUMENTS OF THE INDICATED EMPLOYEES AND OFFICIALS OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH, PAYABLE AS HEREINAFTER PROVIDED AND EFFECTIVE AS OF THE ADOPTION OF THIS ORDINANCE, AND THE PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SUCH ADOPTION, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE LAW, AND CONTINUING IN EFFECT UNTIL THEREAFTER AMENDED, EXCEPT WHERE OTHERWISE SPECIFIED.

THE EMPLOYEES AND OFFICIALS OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH COVERED BY THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE COMPENSATED BI-WEEKLY PURSUANT TO THE FOLLOWING SALARY GUIDE FOR THE FISCAL YEARS BEGINNING JULY 1, 2011 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2015.
