ORDINANCE NO. 2014-219:

An Ordinance fixing the Salaries, Wages and other Emoluments of the Employees of the Borough of Union Beach, Monmouth County, New Jersey

Pursuant to a Collective Bargaining Agreement with Teamsters Local No. 641 For the Calendar year 2014, 2015 and 2016

Be it Ordained by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Union Beach, as follows:

<u>Section 1:</u> The following shall constitute the salaries, wages and emoluments of the indicated employees of the Borough of Union Beach, payable as hereinafter provided and effective as of the adoption of this Ordinance, and the publication of notice of such adoption, in accordance with law, and continuing in effect until thereafter amended, except where otherwise specified. The employees of the Borough of Union Beach covered by this ordinance shall be compensated bi-weekly pursuant to the following salary guide for calendar years 2014, 2015 and 2016.

<u>Section 2</u>: On initial hire, employees will be paid 70% of what the job title is paid by current salary ordinance. After completion of one (1) year on the job, employee will be paid 80% of what the job title is paid by current salary ordinance. After completion of two (2) years on the job, the employee will be paid 90% of what the job title is paid by current salary ordinance. After completion of three (3) years on the job, the employee will be paid 100% of what the job title is paid by current salary ordinance.

<u>Section 3</u>: Any benefits required to be accorded or paid to or on behalf of any employee designated herein under any collective bargaining agreement, the execution of which was duly authorized by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Union Beach, shall be deemed authorized by this Ordinance.

<u>Section 4</u>: All salaries, wages and other compensation authorized by this Ordinance shall be paid retroactively, effective to January 1, 2014, provided that the employee was still in the employ of the Borough of Union Beach at the time of the execution of the adoption of this Ordinance. All salaries,

wages and other compensation authorized by this Ordinance shall commence on January 1 of 2015 and 2016.

<u>Section 5</u>: All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance shall be deemed repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES AND DEPARTMENT HEADS: MEETING OPEN FOR PUBLIC DISCUSSION:

Councilman Mascilak: Library, Drug Alliance, EMS and Seniors

<u>Drug Alliance:</u> The Halloween Dance for the 3rd and 4th Grades was cancelled due to lack of chaperones. The Valentines Day Dance will be held on February 13th. They are still looking for chaperones. There is a dance tomorrow night for grades 5- through 8 from 7-9 p.m. There is a \$5.00 admission fee and they also need chaperones for this dance. Chaperones get one child in to the dance for free.

<u>Library:</u> Pictures with Santa will be held on Sunday, November 30th from 2-4 p.m. The price for pictures will be \$5.00. No outside pictures like cell phone, cameras, private cameras, etc. will be permitted.

There will be a Frozen Fling with the characters from the movie Frozen on Saturday, December 27th from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. or from 2-4 p.m. Due to limited space, the sales for these tickets will begin during the Pictures with Santa Event. The Frozen Fling Tickets will be \$12.00 per child.

EMS: There is no report for this month.

Councilman Wicki: Finance, Personnel and Administration

Personnel Committee has met with the Police Chief and Captain to discuss contract negotiations. The Committee has presented a proposal to the entire Council and we will continue those discussions next month. It is our hope that we will have these contracts wrapped up by the end of the year.

Finance Committee has begun reaching out to the various departments in the Borough to initiate Budget Discussions for the 2015 Municipal Budget.

Tonight's Agenda contains a request to prepare bids and specifications to continue our turf management program. We have redone the soccer fields and the other fields in town. The Soccer field is looking great and once we reopen it in the Spring for the Soccer Teams, there will be a noticeable improvement. We would like to continue this plan forward, with all of our fields to make sure they get through the necessary nutrients and cuttings. We will prepare a three year plan to continue this program.

Army Corp of Engineer Project: The Mayor and Council have been working on this project for many years and it is something that we continually work on even when it is not in the forefront of everyone's mind. The most recent part of the project was for a reevaluation study to be done by the Army Corp which was completed and that report was sent off to the State at the end of the summer. We have requested to meet with the State and have the State come to our December Agenda Meeting to discuss the findings of that study and to review where we go forward from there.

At the end of the summer we were able to do some paving on <u>Henry Street</u>. It was just an overlay of paving to try to eliminate many potholes. There have been some complaints about water collecting on the street. We had our Engineer, Dennis Dayback go over to the site with the inspector and they realize what the problem is and they hope to make those repairs over the next two weeks. This is one of the reasons why we try to avoid doing projects like this because it is difficult. The roads that we usually reconstruction include the complete drainage, grading, curbing. We know some streets are in bad shape and it takes a long time to get a street done, but it costs a lot more money because we are trying to do it correctly, so that when the contractor leaves, everyone is happy. We ask everyone to be patient. We have made progress on our roads. We have gotten a lot of the roads done over the years even though we are restricted to certain areas due to certain grant programs. We do try to move forward with these programs.

Councilwoman Roche: Public Works & Building and Grounds

The Fall Clean up is in full swing around the Borough including Debris and Vegetation removal. The Street Sweeper has been fixed and they have started to clean the streets again. Repairs to the mechanic's garage are continuing as well as repairs to the Public Works Building and the Baytex Building. The property clean ups and mowing of the bank owned properties continue with the DPW Department working closely with the Code Enforcement Department to get these properties clear. Councilwoman Roche thanks all those involved in the cleanups. The Eagle Scout Project with John Coker is on-going. This would be the Jack Pinto Sign for the Playground at Firefighter's Park. John Haines has put the Duct Cleaning for Borough Hall and the DPW Building. Two Quotes have been received and no decision has yet been made. The Street Signs and no parking signs are still being replaced as needed throughout the Borough. Joe Van Orden makes the signs in-house which is a savings for the Borough.

The American Legion is next week so she has no update on this.

On Saturday, November 8th was the free rabies clinic at the DPW Yard. Great day. The event was an overwhelming success we had 67 dogs from Union Beach. 3 out of town Dogs and 17 Cats were all given rabies shots. He thanks Eileen Balut and Gert Brunelli for their efforts.

Police Department Report September 2014:

The Police Department provided security and traffic control for the visits from Gov. Christie, Senators Menendez, Senator Booker and HUD Secty. Castro. The Police Department investigated 6 motor vehicle crashes with one injury. There were three arrests made for DWI. There were 54 summonses issued for October. The Police Department also participated in the Monmouth County Prosecutors Office "Unplugged and Alive" campaign to issue warning summonses for distracted driving. As always training is ongoing for our Police Department, Sgt. Taddeo and Ptl Gilkinson completed a class on the Attorney General's Internal Affairs Policies and Procedures sponsored by the Monmouth County Prosecutors Office. Patrolman Gajewski completed the Unplugged and Alive initiative from the Monmouth County Prosecutors. Ptl. Gilkinson completed an Internal Affairs Investigations Course. Ptl. Harriot completed a hyperdrive comprehensive narcotics investigations school. Ptl Tuberion completed a train-the trainer course for planning our active shooter drill. Sgt. Taddeo completed a Remington 870 Police Arms Course. Sgt. Farese continues to work on the Prophenix System for Dispatch.

There were 665 entries for calls for service and Police information. The Police Department received a check for \$2,673.18 for the Drunk Driving Enforcement Fund. Sgt. Kelly continues to instruct the 5th grade students at Memorial School in the Dare Program. The children are taught about the dangers of drugs, alcohol and smoking.

Councilman Andreuzzi: Education, Recreation and Special Grants

The Recreation Commission would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who participated and attended the October 26th Halloween Party at Memorial School. More than 140 Union Beach children danced to the music provided by resident DJ Ron Capichana. Juice, snacks and Halloween gift bags complimented the event. Santa Claus is scheduled to arrive here at Union Beach Borough Hall at 6 p.m. on Sunday, December 7th in honor of our annual Tree Lighting. Santa will also be distributing wrapped gifts to all children in attendance.

<u>Board of Education –</u> On October 21st the Board of Education recognized 25 students who recorded a perfect score of 300 in the New Jersey ASK tests. This is an outstanding accomplishment. The Mayor and Council join them in recognizing this extraordinary accomplishment. The school custodial staff continues interior and exterior maintenance projects through the Columbus Day weekend replacing much needed lighting in some of the classrooms and upgrading the playground area. A much needed uninvent replacement plan has been put into motion. Upgrading uninvent fans that deliver the heat in the classrooms some of which were damaged by the storm more than two years ago. A representative of the Keyport High School Student Council attended the Board of Education Meeting for the first time at the last meeting. The objective of this new initiative is to encourage more students to participate in Keyport High School Events and Fundraisers.

<u>Post Sandy Planning Project Steering Committee</u>: is currently in its second round of planning studies, including a comprehensive Master Plan fully funded through a Department of Community Affairs Service Grant. The focus is the Route 36 Corridor and the Union Avenue Business Zone. To this end, the Committee in concert with T&M Associates will be holding a series of meetings this weekend, Friday, Saturday and Monday to solicit the input of valuable stakeholders throughout the Borough. The meetings are designed to identify the needs and establish goals and objectives of the study. This is one of five projects that have to be completed by the Planning Committee by April.

The Mayor and Council would like to thank all of the volunteers who participated in the October Clean Ocean Action Beach Sweeps. We also extend our thanks to our DPW Department who helped remove more than a truck load of debris collected at the beachfront.
