ORDINANCE NO.: 2024-332:

MEETING OF FEBRUARY 15, 2024

An Ordinance Amending and Supplementing Ordinance No. 2021-310 Adopted December 16, 2021 Fixing the Minimum and Maximum Salary Ranges of Certain Officials and Employees of the Borough of Union Beach, County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Union Beach has adopted Salary Ordinance No. 2021-310 which establishes a minimum and maximum salary range for certain positions within the Borough; and

WHEREAS, the Borough finds it necessary to amend and supplement said Ordinance No. 2021-310 as shown below.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Borough of Union Beach that Ordinance No. 2021-310 adopted on December 16, 2021 is amended and supplemented as follows:

Section 1. The salary range of the below listed titles is amended to read as shown below:

Section 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 3. Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40:69A-181 (b), this ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after its final passage by the Borough Council and approval by the Mayor where such approval is required by law.

<u>Councilman Wicki:</u> Finance is looking forward to having the Budget meeting within the next couple weeks for the year 2024. Hope to be able to introduce something in March. Resolution on tonight's agenda for some appropriations that are necessary to do prior to the budget being adopted. Personnel committee conducted interviews this evening to fill the position of Technical Assistant to the Construction Official. As we review the results of this interview we will keep the Council up to date. Councilman Wicki congratulates our Deputy Clerk Carol Seney on her retirement. He tells us that we all know if you wanted the honest opinion, Carol was the one to go too. Carol was a great asset to Union Beach and surely will be missed.

<u>Councilman Riccardi:</u> Library met with the PTA to try to get more parents and children involved in the library. They had a very successful take your child to the library day on Saturday, February 3rd. Still awaiting to find out when they are going to hold their Spring fundraiser. Board of Health held their annual Reorganization meeting and President is Peter Petrocelli along with Vice President Tim Perrella. The new time for the Board of Health meeting is going to be 6pm on

the third Mondays. Issued 82 dog licenses last month. Community Alliance held their meeting last night but due to a work obligation, Councilman Riccardi could not attend.

<u>Councilwoman Roche:</u> American Legion had a successful Murder Mystery fundraiser. They hold this event once a year and it is always a good time. Sons of the American Legion have a pancake breakfast this Sunday, February 18th from 10am. Plans are progressing for the annual Memorial Day parade run by the Legion and Frank Wells. Cheri's father Harry is going to be the Grand Marshall. Llyod Coffey is also going to be working along side of Frank Wells for the parade to assist in anyway he can. Bands are booked for the weekends, please check Facebook for the lineup. Shuffle board is on Sundays, check the website for information. February 22nd is the next spaghetti dinner fundraiser. Board of Education held a special meeting last night to discuss hires, bus aids and various stipends. The next full meeting is on February 27th and the agenda can be found on the Union Beach Board of Education website.

Councilwoman Woodruff: Public Works has done a great job with the salting and plowing for the winter season. The Mayor & Council thanks them for their hard work and long hours put in. All the vehicles that were used in the last storm on Tuesday have been fixed and ready for the next impending storm coming up this weekend. Additional drop downs were added to the town's website for residents on Report A Concern for non-emergency and alleviating the amount of phone calls DPW is receiving. Two new lawnmowers are needed in town and quotes have been received. Purchasing for this equipment will be made within the next month. Crack sealer is needed and renting one is more feasible from a vendor. We have received quotes and it is the most cost-efficient decision. Bids have been put out for the Turf Maintenance program and sprinkler systems around town. The bidding will be closed on Wednesday, February 28th. Bathrooms at Helen Hayes are under renovation. Outside maintenance was done to both buildings. Soccer complex is going to be opened on March 1st and prep will begin this week as long as the weather cooperates. Scholer Park baseball fields will also begin work as soon as the snow melts. Notifications have been sent to the Bayshore League to paint their shed before the upcoming season. Pothole patrol is looking to make their rounds early next week, weather pending. Union Beach Recreation met last month and went through their events for the 2024 year. A new tree has been picked out but they are looking to talk to the company to see if artificial decorations can be added. Voting on the tree will take place on February 26th. Easter Egg Hunt will be held on March 16th from 10am-2pm at Scholer Park, rain date is March 23nd. A Google sheet will be created and ready for signups so Recreation can contain crowd control. Please find the Google Sheet on their Facebook page. UBSA soccer sign ups are still ongoing and the last walk-up is Friday, February 23rd from 7-8pm in the Seniors Room. Recreation soccer starts April 6th and travel will begin on March 17th.

<u>Councilman Andreuzzi:</u> Planning committee there has been no meetings and communications with developers. Concept plans for 711 Union Avenue, Florence and Front, Union Avenue all appear to stay on track.

Union Beach Fire Department responded to a total of 19 calls. The total operational/response man hours for the month were: 350 hours 48 minutes. The Department is caught up on all training needed for the new year. Police Department had 986 calls in total. 81 traffic stops, 3 warrant arrests, 27 summons, 6 motor vehicle crashes and 32 EMS assists. Records received \$75 in discovery fees, \$335 in firearm permits, 30 OPRA, communications back and forth with Prosecutors is 5. UBPD responded on February 4th with the Sheriff's Office, MOCERT, MCPO and other surrounding towns to a barricaded subject in his home and in possession of guns. They negotiated peacefully and the male surrender and sent to Bayshore for evaluation. Detective Bureau investigation, 1 sexual assault and 6 stolen catalytic convertors. Catalytic convertors being stolen from vehicles is becoming a problem in the Bayshore and they are working with the MCPO and NY Auto Theft Office, Keyport, Tinton Falls, Piscataway and Jersey City PD. Case open for a reported stolen dog and they are actively working with the SCPA. Firearms issued 5 firearm ID cards, 10 permits to purchase, 3 change of address, 5 firearm background checks, 15 emails for applications and 1 conceal carry weapon. 2 registrations for Megan's Law. 3 investigations and background checks for new hires.

Mayor Cocuzza extends an appreciation to the UBPD, MCSO, MCPO and surrounding police departments that assisted with the barricaded individual a few weeks ago. Everyone did a great job and we appreciate all their efforts. Mayor also extends a thank you to the Public Works on their work in the last snow storm. The town looked fantastic and they did a great job. Mayor Cocuzza also wishes Carol Seney a wonderful retirement and will miss her remarks within the office. She was a great person to have in Union Beach and he appreciates all of her work.

MEETING OPEN FOR PUBLIC DISCUSSION: February 15, 2024

Borough Attorney John T. Lane, Jr. addresses the public with the following statement: "I believe a lot of people are here tonight to discuss the matter involving a dog that has been taken. It is an open investigation. Mayor & Council do not run the day-to-day operations of the Police Department. That is done by the Chief and is supervised by the Monmouth County Prosecutors Office. We are working with the Prosecutors Office and the Humane Society. Everything we know about the investigation cannot be discussed in an opening setting by the Police or anybody else. We know people have concerns and certainly everybody is here to express those concerns but we cannot make representation that we are going

to do anything to control the day-to-day activities of the Police Department. They are working very hard on this and hope to bring it to a conclusion. They have leads but they are not going to discuss them here nor is any member of the Council.

<u>Kinara Maxwell, 530 Clark Avenue-</u> I have been a resident of Union Beach since 2009. I moved to this town because this is a town where our kids can play in the street, ride our bikes to the park and our dogs do not get stolen. Do you any of you Council Members follow Blu's page? *Councilwoman Roche raises her hand* Thank you. Any others?

Councilman Lewandowski: I see them. I see all your comments.

Maxwell: Are you on the page sir?

Councilman Lewandowski: I do not know if I am on it but I see everything you post.

<u>Maxwell:</u> Why wouldn't you be on the page? It is something that has took place in your town.

<u>Councilman Lewandowski:</u> There is a lot that takes place in town that I am not following everything.

Maxwell: It is not a concern to you?

<u>Councilman Lewandowski:</u> I did not say that. <u>Maxwell:</u> Then would you not follow our page?

Councilman Lewandowski: Is our Police department investigating it?

Maxwell: They just opened a case, yes.

<u>Councilman Lewandowski:</u> Case has been opened for a while. You heard it. It was just in the report. <u>Maxwell:</u> Is there a reason why you cannot follow Blu's page? Show some support to a missing dog in Union Beach. I mean if it was your dog, would you want the same support?

<u>Mayor Cocuzza:</u> What is important is that we do support you, we do want to see your dog come home.

Maxwell: You do not follow the page, Charlie.

<u>Mayor Cocuzza:</u> I do not need to follow the page. Honestly, with an open investigation I would not follow the page. Not only with Blu but any open investigation. Most of our issues that we run into here are, we have to remain neutral. Especially in a criminal investigation. We cannot interfere and we can not get involved. There are actually statutes to this that prevent us from getting involved. So to get to close to any situation would not be good for any of us.

Maxwell: Can I get a copy of those statutes?

Mayor Cocuzza: Yes, you could.

<u>Attorney-Lane:</u> The statute about how the Police and why the Mayor and Council do not run the Police department?

Maxwell: The statutes that say you cannot follow Blu's page.

Lane: I do not think that is what he said. I think what he said in an open investigation.

Maxwell: He said it is a personal choice.

<u>Councilwoman Roche:</u> It is a personal choice. I do not follow every page in town either. I just happened to see it and clicked on it. I cannot constantly follow every page that everyone puts on with their concerns.

Maxwell: It is one page regarding a dog that was stolen.

Councilman Wicki: Not all of us follow social media.

<u>Maxwell:</u> Some of you are not on social media but a few of you are.

Councilman Wicki: Does not mean I do not care if I am not social media.

<u>Councilwoman Roche:</u> We all have dogs. My heart goes out.

Councilman Wicki: What is your point?

<u>Maxwell:</u> My point is, my dog vanished on January 17th and it took a while to have any police reaction to it or for it to be taken seriously. I am sitting here in a town where I pay taxes to live and the Council members that are voted in do not really have a concern for it.

Councilman Wicki: Was the dog licensed?

Maxwell: No. That is also another thing, why do we pay licensing fees? What is that for?

Cocuzza: State law.

Councilman Wicki: If someone found Blu, they would know where to bring her back too. Right?

Maxwell: If she was licensed?

Councilman Wicki: Yes, if she was licensed. Is Blu vaccinated? We don't know that.

Maxwell: She is.

Councilman Wicki: We are worried about puppies' health and well-being.

Lane: The idea of a central registry is if anyone found the dog and we have the license, we have records that the rabies is up to date. It is \$10 a year, it is not a money maker. It is required by State law that every dog in town is licensed after a certain age, 6 months to a year, has to be licensed. We keep records of the rabies to make sure the dogs have proper vaccinations. It is important and if a dog is lost that is another way to find it. If it was found with a collar, with a license number than we know where to bring them.

<u>Mayor Cocuzza:</u> Requirement of the licensing is a state law. Municipality carries it out but it is a State requirement.

<u>Dawn Smith- 666 Shore Concourse, Keyport:</u> I think the issue is we are here because this dog is stolen and we know it. The bottom line is nothing is being done about it. There are a lot of mixed feelings, she is

obviously upset but it was stolen from a criminal in our town. Nothing is being done. We want her home, somebody in this town has her and we know it but nobody wants to listen to it. That is the bottom line. We just need people to help us, we want her home. It is not like she ran away and got lost, she was stolen. That is a big difference. Nobody is looking at the other points of it. There is a little boy that is sick to his stomach, he wont go to school. There is more to it. We just want her home and you guys can help us. That's it.

<u>Janet Kelly, 50 Shore Court Middletown-</u> I am here to tell you that Blu's Facebook page has over 10,000 people on the administration side. The people on the page want her home. The interest in having her come home is huge. I do not know if you saw it by NJ.com did a story on the dog. The community and the family are doing everything they can to get this dog home. They have sent out flyers, shared tens of thousands of times, enlisted help of the media, put up drones, put up a generous reward for the dog. Superbowl Sunday businesses in the community had her flyer in their storefronts, had the pizza deliveries for Superbowl. It is very important because our dogs are family members, part of the pack. Please keep that in mind. I know you are the mayor and you are saying we are not the Police Department but you are the head of the town. Do you not appoint the police commissioner?

Mayor Cocuzza: There is a police Chief?

Kelly: Do you appoint him?

Mayor Cocuzza: Well, the police chief works up through the ranks.

Kelly: What I want to say is, the relationship between the community and the police is a two-way street. Sometimes you need our help and sometimes we need your help. The community needs your help, its just an appeal for you to help find the dog. There is 2 people in the neighborhood who know what happened to this dog. I am not a detective but I am a mother. I can tell you something, I can speak for a lot of Moms here. We do detective work for our children and we are always watching. If I was doing the detective work, the least amount of thing I would do and I do not know what they are doing behind the scenes, but what I would do is find out the make and model of these two individuals. Find out their license plates number, there is cameras everywhere. There is only so many ways they can leave the street. There are cameras everywhere. *Kelly goes onto to tell a story about her son's bicycle going missing and how the Red Bank PD worked hard to return it to her son.*

Rose Paoletti, 616 Park Avenue- First, if you are not on the page, please take one of these flyers. We have been handing this out, hanging these endlessly, please at least take them. Share with your neighbors and with the community. Kinara has been fighting to get her dog back for weeks now. I have never been to one of these meetings and I am little ashamed about how she was treated. She should not have been treated the way she was because of a license. I understand, every dog should have a license, I get that but that is not the issue.

<u>Mayor Cocuzza:</u> I do not think anyone was berated. It was just being pointed out that if Blu was licensed, when someone comes across Blu at some point, they would be able to know who she belongs too.

<u>Paoletti:</u> A stolen dog, the first thing that is going to be taken off is the collar. Yes, I agree the dog should be licensed. I am ashamed and embarrassed about how this woman was treated. On the 20th of January, the ACO and the Police went into the home at 610 Park Avenue. There were two pit bulls, did they have licenses?

Mayor Cocuzza: No, they were puppies. They were not of age.

Councilman Lewandowski: Under 6 months they do not need to be vaccinated.

Crowd is saying you do not know how old they are.

<u>Mayor Cocuzza:</u> The police were informed and I cannot give much more than that. All is speculation regarding if they were in a closet.

<u>Paoletti:</u> No, it is not speculation. I am assuming that you all understand and all know what happened in Neptune this weekend.

Mayor Cocuzza: Yes.

<u>Paoletti:</u> I am assuming you all understand what happens with dogs that are bred to fight. They are locked in dark closets and cages so they do not socialize. These two dogs were locked in a closet so they do not socialize. It is appalling to me that an ACO went into this house, saw these two puppies. Do we know the dogs are 6 months old? Do we know dogs are locked in closets? Maybe. I apologize to anyone if they are. However, this woman does not deserve how she was treated today. Please help, hang these, put them in your cars, do anything to help get Blu home.

<u>Eileen Balut- 311 Central Avenue</u>: In front of her house, there is water along the walkway. The other day when it was freezing out, the water froze. Why is there water between 309 and 314 Central Avenue? There is not water on the other side.

Mayor Cocuzza: There is a relief valve there for the fire hydrant.

Balut: This water has been here in front of my house for a while. I am not going to put a time frame but I do know it has been there for a while. I would appreciate it if someone can take a look at it along with given a report.

Mayor Cocuzza: I will have Dennis Dayback look at it.

Edward Glucksman, 12B Rose Lane- Requesting action in response to the feral cat colony plaguing our community. Since 2004 this inappropriately and inadequately managed colony located on the Henry Hudson Trail near Rose Lane and Jersey Avenue. Mr. Glucksman goes into great lengths to inform the Mayor and Council about all the wild animals that are now sharing food with the cat colony. He is worried about the community's health along with the cats and wishes something to done. Mr. Glucksman would also like the status, 501c be looked at regarding this foundation be reviewed. Mr. Glucksman provides pictures for evidence.

<u>Mayor Cocuzza</u> informs him that he is going to get the Monmouth County Humane Society and SCPA and involved to fix this matter.

<u>Glucksman:</u> Wants the committee to know that since the colony is on IFF private property they cannot do anything about it. IFF needs to address the Humane Society directly.

Mayor Cocuzza: Give us some time and we will try to figure something out.

Jenn Hayes, 729 Campbell Avenue Port Monmouth- A lot of us wake up mornings to night searching for this dog and praying every day. Not trying to get anyone in trouble but sometimes it is just your approach and handle this situation. Maybe everyone needs a little bit training. The way that the police talked to my friend was infuriating. *Hayes goes into specific details regarding how the Police approached certain situations, phrases they used and body language. Hayes goes into more details that the Police repeatedly gave the wrong paperwork and it took numerous days to get a phone call back.*

Mayor Cocuzza interrupts to say, from the moment the police department came aware of this in the mid of January, he has been receiving weekly updates about how they are handling this. Any belief, any statement saying they are not doing everything they can or not going above and beyond would be false. I know all of our police officers and there was a statement made about community involvement. Our Police go above and beyond with community involvement. They are not going to always tell you exactly what they are doing. They are not going to lead you to believe with anything. Just because a police officer was off the next day does not mean it is not being worked on.

<u>Hayes:</u> When an officer promises to make the phone call, I at least want a follow through. The way she was brushed off and spoken too was not very nice and that is what I want to express. I hope people are involved and of course we want to know everything during every step of the way and I know we need to be patience. <u>Mayor Cocuzza:</u> They are very involved. Tuesday evening, I was here at Borough Hall for 2-3 hours meeting with the Chief, Captain and lead Sergeant being briefed on everything that has been done since this moment. I can assure you that what they have done and what they are doing. As Councilman Lewandowski said earlier that the police department is involved in other things like the catalytic convertors and these things keep going. However, they manage to keep this with the rest of the things. I have all the trust and faith in them that they are doing everything they can. I do not appreciate them being bashed when I know what they are doing. I cannot share that with you Kinara.

<u>Kinara from the crowd:</u> We are not bashing officers. We are not bashing the department on the page. We are very grateful for the Union Beach Police Department.

<u>Mayor Cocuzza</u>: At the end of the day, I know they are working on this. Some of us can look at it and say there is a priority list of things that happen. They did not drop this. This is the easiest thing to drop and say I have other things to do because this is a lost animal. The Police department is going above and beyond. I wish I could share with all of you but I cannot. We all hope she is found and that a dog cannot vanish.

Crowd gets involved and becomes a discussion but quickly brough to a halt.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Union Beach in the County of Monmouth finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2024 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that a 3.5 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$249,678.78, in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS the Governing Body hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Union Beach in the County of Monmouth, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2024 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Union Beach shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$349,550.29 and that the CY 2024 municipal budget for the Borough of Union Beach be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Union Beach, in the County of Monmouth, New Jersey (the "Borough"), has heretofore adopted one bond ordinance authorizing bonds to finance part of the cost of various general improvements in said Borough; and

heretofore finally adopted. The average period of usefulness is 15 years.

Section 2. The bonds referred to in Section 1 hereof are hereby combined into one consolidated issue of bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$600,000 and are sometimes hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Bonds." The bonds referred to in Subsection A shall be designated "General Improvement Bonds, Series 2024" and shall be numbered with the prefix G from one (1) consecutively upward. The bonds of said consolidated issue shall be dated the date of delivery of the Bonds and will be issued in fully registered form The Bonds of said issue (i) shall be dated the date of delivery of the Bonds, (ii) shall mature in the years 2025 through 2029, or such other years as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer, (iii) shall be ar interest at the interest rates per annum as determined by the Chief Financial Officer, (iv) shall be sold at such price or prices as determined by the Chief Financial Officer, and (v) may be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities as determined by the Chief Financial Officer, as shall be set forth in the proposal for the purchase of the Bonds acceptance of which is authorized pursuant to Section 5 hereof. The Bonds shall be numbered one consecutively upward, and will be issued in fully registered form.

Section 3. The Bonds shall be payable as to principal on the first day of March in lawful money of the United States of America at the administration office of the Borough in Union Beach, New Jersey, and payable as to interest semi-annually on the first day of March and September, commencing on September 1, 2024, in each year until maturity or prior optional redemption, by check or draft mailed on such interest payment date to the owners thereof registered as such as of each next preceding August 15 and February 15. Interest on the Bonds shall be calculated on the basis of a 360-day year of twelve 30-day calendar months.

Section 4. The Bonds shall be signed by the Mayor or Deputy Mayor and the Borough Chief Financial Officer, by their manual or facsimile signatures, and the corporate seal of the Borough shall be affixed thereto, or imprinted or reproduced thereon and shall be attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Clerk or Deputy Clerk of the Borough.

Section 5. The Bonds are hereby sold and awarded to the purchaser thereof as shall be determined by the Chief Financial Officer at a price determined by the Chief Financial Officer pursuant to the terms of a proposal for the purchase of the Bonds. The Mayor, Deputy Mayor and Chief Financial Officer are hereby authorized on behalf of the Borough to execute the acceptance of such proposal for the purchase of the Bonds.

Section 6. The Bonds and the registration provisions endorsed thereon shall be in substantially the following form:
