WHEREAS, the municipal committee of the political party (Republican) shall present within 15 (fifteen days) to the Borough Council the names of three candidates for the selection of a successor, until a successor is duly elected at the General Election of November 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS, within 30 (thirty days) of the occurrence, the Governing Body must fill the vacancy of Mayor Paul J. Smith, Jr. whose term expires on December 31, 2023 by appointment (N.J.S.A. 40A:16-11) for a period until such time a successor is duly elected at the General election of November 3, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Republican Organization of the Borough of Union Beach has not submitted any names of candidates;

COMMENTS BY APPOINTED MAYOR:

Comments by Mayor Wicki

He thanks the Council for their confidence in him to assume this role of Mayor for the time being. He states, "it is impossible to fill the shoes that were left empty on April 30th and he can only hope that he can take the lessons learned by serving with Paul for 20 years and serve with the same integrity that he displayed in his service for all of his time."

Mayor Wicki reminds all of how the Borough of Madison came to the aid of Union Beach during and after Hurricane Sandy when we were in great need. They were so supportive to us and many great friendships were formed during that time. The Governing Body of Madison has passed a Resolution in memory of Paul Smith and Mayor Connelly is with us tonight to share this Resolution with us tonight (via teleconference)

Mayor Conley comments that Mayor Paul Smith is looking down on Mayor Wicki right now and sees that Mayor Wicki will do very well and follow proudly in his footsteps. This pandemic has been very difficult for everyone and certainly made it more difficult for Union Beach during the loss of you beloved Mayor. He states it was an honor to know Mayor Paul for almost eight years and you could tell he loved Union Beach and loved his town as Mayor over his 12 plus years as Mayor. He can only imagine the loss we are feeling. He reads a Resolution in memory Mayor Smith and will send the actual copy on file to Union Beach.

Councilwoman Roche

Emergency Svs. (Fire, OEM) Education & American Legion

Mrs. Roche reports from the Fire Department for the month of April:

Total Volunteer Man-hours for incident response for the month of April- 61.27 hours.

Training has been postponed due to COVID 19 distancing. They have planned on-line virtual training for the Department for the month of May.

There will be a Memorial Service on Sunday at 11 a.m.

The American Legion will have a Memorial Day Service on Saturday. She will attend both services. These services will be small. Social distancing is recommended. The American Legion gave away 50 meals today to veterans. These were donated by the Neptune American Legion.

Councilman Cavallo Public Affairs, Seniors, Court & Special Grants

Mr. Cavallo announces that all his Committees have not been meeting due to COVID and therefore he does not have a report this month.

Councilman Lewandowski Health, Library, Recreation & Drug Alliance

The <u>Library</u> has scheduled a meeting for tomorrow at 12:00. It will be their first meeting since the pandemic has started. He will report back if anything of urgency comes up, if not he will wait to report at the next meeting.

Recreation Commission: Mr. Lewandowski discusses the Fireworks and Mr. Wicki states that we have been waiting for a directive from the Governor on this. Discussion as the Governor has directed there be no fireworks and we do not wish to lose any deposits, etc. if we cancel at the last minute. Discussion to postpone to September or Labor Day weekend. We wish to do something when this is over. Mayor Wicki defers to the Governor's rulings. Mr. Lewandowski will check to see if they will allow us to postpone until September – possibly part of Union Beach Day. We can discuss further at next Agenda meeting. This is fluid because we do not know when this would be allowed again.

Mr. Lewandowski requests the Clerk's Office to update the website to notify residents of the Memorial Day Parade cancellation and the Fireworks postponement.

Mr. Lewandowski reports from the Police Chief that with the Holiday weekend coming up at the beachfront crowding discussion were held regarding allowing the beachfront to be utilized by residents only. This is not allowed as per the Governor's Office. The Chief of Police will do what is necessary; move people, tickets if necessary, etc. masks are not mandatory on the beach itself – they are recommended, however. Social distancing is mandatory.

Planning Board:

The Planning Board will be reviewing several ordinance changes at next week's meeting and they will subsequently be remanded back to the Council for formal adoption.

Environmental:

Clean Ocean Action has cancelled the spring beach sweeps. The next beach sweep is scheduled for October. The Bayshore Watershed Council and the Save Coastal Wildlife Council have postponed many projects during the pandemic. The suggestion is to check the website as there are gradual changes taking place in June and beyond. The website is www.savecoastalwildlife.org.

Public Works:

The Department of Public Works continues to work on Spring and Summer projects at all parks. Catch basins and outfalls continued to be cleaned and residents may contact the DPW if needed. Curbside pick up particularly of bulk and electronics continue uninterrupted. Residents may contact the DPW for potholes and should refer to DPW schedule for street sweeping. The deadline is May 27th for the Union Beach Summer Newsletter for those who wish to submit items to the Newsletter. The edition should be delivered to homes by July 1st.

Training: The Daily COVID 19 updates are disseminated to the Union Beach Police Department Personnel. The Chief of Police attends numerous daily briefings on the COVID 19 pandemic. Numerous blocks of training were available to all department members via the Power DMS Portal. All Officers received annual in-service training regarding mandatory Attorney General training, continual K9 and MOCERT training and RDF training as well. The Chief of Police, Michael Woodrow, was chosen to speak on May 12th to the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies on behalf of the Monmouth County Sheriff's Department. The Chief spoke about Sheriff Golden's progressive Law Enforcement program and the Police Academy, Law Enforcement and Communications Divisions.

The Union Beach Police Department along with the FBI arrested at 67-year-old male on child pornography charges. We had all read about this recently.

He will submit the 3-page report to the Clerk for submission to the Minutes.

The Police Department remembers and prays for Mayor Paul J. Smith, Jr. who passed away on April 30, 2020.

Mr. Cocuzza extends a sincere thank you and appreciation to all of the emergency personnel and the residents of Union Beach who came out to pay their final respects to Mayor Smith. It was very touching. He will be forever missed and will be forever remembered. It was deeply appreciated.

SECTION 1

Chapter XIII (Land Use and Development Regulations), Section 13-5 (General Provisions), Subsection 13-5.31 (Clearing and Grading) shall be amended as follows:

13-5.31 Clearing and Grading

For individual building lots, no fill in excess of 100 cubic yards shall be placed on any property within the Borough of Union Beach, nor shall any soil be removed from any property within the Borough of Union Beach without the prior approval of the borough. Approval of a site plan or subdivision showing such filling or removal or approval of a grading plan upon the advice of the borough engineer and/or planning board shall constitute such approval of the borough.

Where soil removal or fill exceeds 100 cubic yards changes the existing grade of the property, a grading plan will be required for review and approval upon advice of the borough engineer. The proposed grading shall be in a

manner so as to permit the continued flow of natural drainage and shall not cause surface water to be blocked or dammed to create ponding either on the subject property upon which such is located or on any adjacent lots.

Prior to issuance of a final certificate of occupancy, an as-built grading plan will be required for review and approval by the borough engineer. The as-built plan shall show the existing grade prior to the removal or fill, as well as the completed grading.

Unless otherwise permitted by a municipal agency, the construction official or his designee, grading plans and/or accompanying information submitted must conform to the following minimum standards:

Chapter XIII (Land Use and Development Regulations) of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Union Beach is hereby amended or supplemented as follows (new text is double <u>underlined</u>, text to be deleted is <u>struck through</u> and notations to the reader and changes in subparagraph designations either with or without changes to content are italicized):

SECTION 1

Chapter XIII (Land Use and Development Regulations), Section 13-5 (General Provisions), Subsection 13-5.8 (Accessory Buildings) shall be amended as follows:

13-5.8 Accessory Building and Structures.

Unless otherwise specified in this chapter, accessory buildings <u>and structures</u> shall conform to the following regulations.

a. through i

(No Change)

j. Unroofed decks and/or raised patios which do not rise above the height of the first floor level may extend up to five (5) feet into the side yard setback; up to ten (10) feet into the front yard setback; and located not less than ten (10) feet from any rear yard lot line. At grade patios shall conform to the accessory structure setbacks as set forth in Section 13-10.3A Schedule A (Schedule of Area, Yard, Setback and Height Requirements) of this chapter.

SECTION 2

Chapter XIII (Land Use and Development Regulations), Section 13-5 (General Provisions), Subsection 13-5.33 (Parking, Garages and Driveways) shall be added as follows:

13-5.33 Parking, Garages and Driveways

- a. <u>A private garage accessory to a principal residential building is permitted in any residential zone</u>
- b. No part of any garage shall be used for residential purposes.
 - The term "residential purposes" used in this subsection is broadly construed as including all normal residential use, excluding only accessory uses such as storage, utilities, mechanical equipment, parking, workshops, property maintenance activities, garden support facilities.
- c. One (1) driveway and one (1) curb cut shall be permitted for lots with less than 100 feet of frontage the R-8 Residential Zone district. Lots with greater than 100 feet of frontage shall have no more than two (2) single driveway curb cuts having a maximum twelve (12) foot width in the R-8 Zone district.
- d. <u>Driveways in the R-8 Zone district shall be set a minimum of two (2) foot from adjacent property lines unless adjacent property owners enter into an agreement for maintaining a joint driveway.</u>
- e. Driveways in the R-8 Zone district shall have a minimum width of nine (9) feet.
- f. <u>Driveway shall have a maximum width of the greater of the width of the garage door plus 2 feet or 12 feet, whichever is greater.</u>
- g. Off street overnight parking shall be permitted only in garages or in driveways. No overnight parking may take place on lawn areas or other portions of the lot not intended for parking. All areas properly used for parking shall be defined and included in lot coverage.
- h. Residential driveways and parking areas shall not occupy more than 40% of the front yard in the R-8 Zone district.

<u>WHEREAS</u>, a co-founder of the local basketball recreation program and girls' softball league, he volunteered for 30 years as a coach and commissioner for the Union Beach-Keyport Beach Little League; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, his greatest challenge during his tenure as Mayor was rebuilding Union Beach, after the destruction of Superstorm Sandy on October 29, 2012; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, honored to be named to President Barack Obama's Sandy Rebuilding Task Force, Mayor Smith proudly never missed a meeting; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, in 2013, Mayor Smith presented former President Jimmy Carter with a key to the borough for his work with Habitat for Humanity rebuilding 13 Union Beach homes in one weekend; and

<u>WHEREAS</u>, a strong bond developed between Union Beach and the Borough of Madison when the Borough of .Madison provided construction assistance to Union Beach during their rebuilding efforts, a friendship that still exists today.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE MONMOUTH COUNTY MUNICIPAL CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUND PROGRAM REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF MONMOUTH AND THE BOROUGH OF UNION BEACH

Whereas, the United States of America, the State of New Jersey, Monmouth County and the Borough of Union Beach have become victims of the COVID-19 Virus and Pandemic (the "Coronavirus"); and

Whereas, the Coronavirus has caused economic damage and hardships to states, counties and municipalities throughout the United States of America; and

Whereas, on March 27, 2020 the Coronavirus Aid Relief and Economic Security Act (the "CARES Act") was signed by President Donald J. Trump; and

Whereas, the CARES Act was enacted, among other purposes, in order to combat the economic damage caused to states, counties and municipalities because of the Coronavirus; and

Whereas, Monmouth County has received CARES Act funds from the Unites States Treasury (the "Stimulus Funds") to be used to reimburse Monmouth County due to economic damage caused to them by the Coronavirus;;and

Whereas, as the recipient of the "Stimulus Funds" it will be the responsibility of Monmouth County to disburse the Stimulus Funds to eligible recipients in accordance with the terms and provisions of the CARES Act and any guidelines or regulations issued by the United States government or any of its agencies and/or departments; and

Whereas, the Freeholders have determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Monmouth County to dedicate a share of the funding to reimburse municipalities for COVID-19 related costs and expenses under the Municipal Coronavirus Relief Fund Program.

Whereas, the Borough of Union Beach has received said agreement from the County of Monmouth and after review find it appropriate to approve same and authorize its execution.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved, that the Borough Council of the Borough of Union Beach hereby approves execution of the aforesaid State Aid Agreement and authorizes the Mayor and Clerk to sign the Agreement on behalf of the Borough of Union Beach and that their signature constitutes acceptance of the terms and conditions of the agreement.
